IN MALAGA: RUT TEATINOS

Malaga City is one of the best destinations to hold a summer language-football programme and meet the high expectations of all parents and students that wish to take advantage of Malaga's ideal position in the glorious Mediterranean Coastline in the South of Spain. Away from all the tourist destinations, the city of Malaga is a real treasure waiting to be discovered. In the comfort of the brand new Teatinos University Halls of Residence the Campus Chelsea FC takes place in modern and spacious surroundings. The air conditioned hall of residence boasts over 180 bedrooms, a 200 seater dining room and 15 spacious classrooms and is situated in a spacious and tranquil part of Malaga, only 10 minutes from the city centre and from the beach. This year we have full usage of the best sports facilities in Malaga, situated at the University, only 600 metres from the students' residence. All Campus Chelsea FC sports activities are held here. The facilities include two 11-aside football pitches plus one 7-aside pitch, an athletics arena, two semi-covered sports centres, a swimming pool as well as paddle and beach volleyball courts.

IN CANTABRIA: El Mazo, Cantabria – English, Football and Multi-Sport activities in a beautiful natural environment

This year the Campus Chelsea FC, Chelsea FC Soccer Schools brings you a fantastic programme of football, English language tuition and outward bound activities designed to enable students to learn English and football in an exciting environment whilst also enjoying outward bound adventure activities. The 11-day course is designed for players from 8 – 16 years old.

The 32,000m2 enclosed campus encompasses fantastic facilities with wonderful gardens. El Mazo is situated in Rada-Voto, next to the nature reserve of Las Marismas de Santona, 12km south of Laredo en the province of Cantabria, Spain.

There are twenty wood cabins perfectly equipped to house children and their monitors. In the main building you can find the main kitchen, the dining room and five classrooms where the students are taught English. The excellent sports facilities include: an outdoor swimming pool, sports centre (with basketball courts and a 5 aside hard court football pitch), tennis courts, one 11-aside and one 7-aside natural grass football pitches, volleyball courts, archery, a multi-adventure tower with a rock-climbing wall, and a Tibetan bridge. Covered and outdoor game zones complete these fantastic facilities.

OUR TEAM

Our pedagogical team is made up of native, qualified, professional teachers, with a far-reaching curriculum, and professional activities instructors, most of whom have been involved in previous ESDE Language Solutions summer schools.

A dedicated team of professionals who place the children's safety, enjoyment and personal development above anything else.

There is a maximum of 14 students per native language teacher and a ratio of 1:16 per Chelsea Soccer School coach. All Chelsea FC staff that attend the course are fully qualified FA standard coaches and have received First Aid courses and are all CRB checked.

The project has met all necessary requirements to ensure that children are offered full academic, legal and safety guarantees. The Campus Chelsea FC will also benefit from the presence of a qualified full-time in-house nurse, guaranteeing personal medical attention to each one of the students, all of whom must previously fill out a medical information sheet. All children will also be covered by an Accident Insurance.

CHELSEA FOOTBALL CLUB

Since Roman Abramovich's arrival at Stamford Bridge in 2003 Chelsea have gone from strength to strength reaffirming their status as one of the number one clubs in England and across the Continent.

Last season proved another thrilling campaign as the club made history, reaching its first Champions League final in Moscow while also narrowly missing out on a third Premier League title in four years on the final day of the season.

Goalkeepers

Goalkeepers are given specific attention at our campus. Chelsea's specially-sent goalkeeping coach holds training every day for two and a half hours. Group numbers are kept low giving each student the opportunity to receive individual training to improve their technical ability in every area.

Campus Chelsea's football course includes:

- ⇒ Ability test
- ⇒ 2 and a half hours' training every day with Chelsea FC's professional coaches
- ⇒ Basic and specific skills training

Intensive English

The three daily English lessons encourage high levels of student participation through dynamic and fun teaching methods. Each level is taught by qualified native teachers in small groups. As well as learning English in a fun way, students also develop their language skills, learning grammar and specific football vocabulary which they then apply directly in their training. At the end of the camp, our students are highly motivated to continue learning and improving their English.

- ⇒ Opportunity to take Trinity College London exams at the end of the campus, to obtain an internationally recognised certificate. (in Malaga only)

Other fun activities in Malaga

At our English and football camp students can take part in many other fun activities. The Olympic Games, volleyball, cricket, energetic games, basketball, Nintendo video games, arts and crafts, drama, mystery night, swimming pool, leadership games, football, tennis...

Other fun activities in Cantabria

Our multi-adventure programme includes many different sports activities: mountain biking in the Aras valley; canoeing on the Rada river; trekking in the nearby mountains; archery; rock climbing, abseiling, Tibetan bridge, introduction to potholing with a visit to a nearby cave; and nature activities. Participation in the activities is dependent upon students' ages and ability levels. With one monitor for every 7 participants, all students can receive a high level of individual attention. Various fun after-dinner activities and one full-day excursion complete this fantastic programme.

3. How do residential students get to the campuses in Malaga and Cantabria?

Parents can bring and collect children at the times stated in the timetable.

At the Malaga campus, there will be a collection system staffed by our monitors from Madrid Atocha to Malaga on the AVE train. The return service includes monitor supervision and bus transfers. This is a return service to and from Madrid - only return tickets, not single tickets, can be purchased in conjunction with this offer.

4. What should the children bring to the Campus?

5. What are the bedrooms like in Cantabria?

It is important to be aware that throughout the Campus students are outdoors surrounded by nature. The accommodation is in wood cabins and not in bedroom as in a residence. That said, living in the cabins is much more fun for the children.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR CANTABRIA

CABIN ALLOCATION: Sharing of cabins is only allowed among students of the same sex and age. **We do try to meet all requests regarding accommodation, but, due to the complexities involved, we cannot guarantee to do so.**

MOBILES AND CALLS - MALAGA

Students may use their own mobiles, which must be clearly marked with their full names and surnames (chargers as well as phones) even though these will be held under the supervision of the Campus, in order to avoid their loss and improper use. Students can use their mobiles on certain days between 15.00 – 15.45. The first days of the Campus are an important time for the students to adapt to their new surroundings and integrate socially with their new friends. It is not recommended to interrupt this process by encouraging a lot of communication with home.

Calls outside of the designated timetable are not permitted, except in case of emergency – please understand that this can interrupt activities or that students may simply not be onsite. Use of the emergency number is solely to speak to those in charge.

* If it is your son's/daughter's birthday and not assigned as a day for home calls, they will of course be able to use their mobile at the assigned time to call home.

As the name indicates, the 'emergency telephone' is ONLY for EMERGENCIES.
Parents can call the emergency number 24 hours a day (students are not permitted to use this phone).

Non-residential students are not permitted under any circumstances to bring their mobiles. Non-residential students are only onsite at the Campus during the day and having their phones with them seriously interrupts their integration into the group. We reserve the right to confiscate students' mobiles if they are brought to the campus.

MOBILES AND CALLS - CANTABRIA

Students may use their own mobiles, which must be clearly marked with their full names and surnames (chargers as well as phones) even though these will be held under the supervision of the Campus, in order to avoid their loss and improper use. Nevertheless, if parents do not wish their children to take their mobiles to the campus, the two onsite calling cabins can be used within the designated calling time.

The first days of the campus are an important time for the students to adapt to their new surroundings and integrate socially with their new friends. It is not recommended to interrupt this process by encouraging a lot of communication with home.

Calls outside of the designated timetable are not permitted, except in case of emergency – please understand that this can interrupt activities or that students may simply not be onsite. Use of the emergency number is solely to speak to those in charge.

As the name indicates, the 'emergency telephone' is ONLY for EMERGENCIES.

* If it is your son's/daughter's birthday and not assigned as a day for home calls, they will of course be able to use their mobile at the assigned time to call home.

* If at any point you feel that your son or daughter wishes to return home before the end of the campus, please encourage them and boost their self-esteem. It is important for their social integration, development and personal autonomy that they stay. Therefore, *after the designated calling time in the timetable*, please speak to us without them knowing that you are going to do so.

Life on a summer camp can sometimes be complex as we have to take into consideration factors like; being away from the family environment, personal space, the child's own high expectations, personal hygiene etc. It is therefore fundamental to take these and other points into consideration before and when your child is with us during his/her stay.

We need the children and parents to understand that there are rules and conditions that need to be adhered to and their input and collaboration is essential for the overall success of the summer camp. It is not just a case of turning up and waiting for things to happen. There has to be an open, honest participation regardless of the aptitude of your child.

We aim to enhance the child's:

- ⇒ Self esteem / Confidence
- ⇒ Independence
- ⇒ Respect to others regardless of race, gender, age or physical and or academic ability
- ⇒ Work ethic within a team
- ⇒ Hygiene and tidiness
- ⇒ Generosity towards others

Finally we ask parents and guardians to take into consideration that children sometimes act very differently when they are away from their home environment. Sometimes they do things they would never consider when they are close to their loved ones. With this in mind we ask all students to respect the campus and their peers' personal belongings and to behave as they would back at home or in their school environment and in accordance to Campus rules.

We will not tolerate unacceptable and anti social behaviour on any account. The parent's guidance to this extent before you leave you child with us is essential.
